I. TEACHING AND ADMINISTRATIVE EXPERIENCE

Professor of Economics and Latin American Studies, California State University, Fullerton since 1973.

I have taught a variety of courses over the years, but I have recently specialized in teaching The Economic Environment (Econ 100), designed for non-economics majors; Principles of Macroeconomics (Econ 202); Economic Development (Econ 333) and Economics of Latin America and the Caribbean (Econ 334). The latter is a course that I developed as a global awareness course for both GE and the CBE.

I have used my research in my development classes regularly. In fact, *The Process of Development* began as lectures and then was published as a book. *Latin America's Economic Development: Institutional and Structuralist Perspectives* began its life as readings for the new Econ 334 course and then, with revisions, became an edited book.

Throughout my career, research and teaching have been interwoven with research results informing class materials and discussions and vice versa.
